-El miércoles **tenemos** clases de piano. ≈ Los miércoles **tenemos** clases de piano. We have piano classes on Wednesdays.

-¿Cuándo **tienen** ustedes clases de piano? When do you have piano classes?

-Los miércoles **tenemos** clases de piano. We have piano classes on Wednesdays.

-**Tenemos** clases de violín todos los jueves. We have violin classes every Thursday.

-¿Cuándo **tienen** ustedes clases de violín? When do you have violin classes?

-Los jueves.

-Alberto **tiene** una guitarra americana. Alberto has an America guitar.

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-Este edificio **no tiene** ascensor. This building doesn't have a lift.

-¿**Tiene** ascensor este edificio? Does this building have a lift?

-No, **no tiene**. No, it doesn't have it.

-**No tengo** nada para ustedes. I have nothing for you.
